She is currently undertaking a PhD research on the technological intensity of natural resource based industries in developing countries, within the PhD Programme entitled "Economic and Policy Studies on Innovation and Technical Change", under the edge of the Maastricht Economic Research Institute for Technology (MERIT) and the United Nations University on Innovation and Technology (UNU-INTECH).
