

**- BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES OF SPEAKERS -**



**Mr. Paul Wessendorp** is the Chief of the Investment Promotion Section at UNCTAD. He is responsible for a global technical assistance programme aimed at strengthening national capacities to promote and facilitate foreign investment. During the 1990s he helped found the World Association of Investment Promotion Agencies (WAIPA) and initiated UNCTAD programmes on good governance and the promotion of green investment. He also led teams that organized UNCTAD's World Investment Forums in Ghana, China, Qatar, and Switzerland. Mr. Wessendorp is author and co-author of several United Nations publications on investment related issues.

Before joining UNCTAD, Mr. Wessendorp worked in the areas of investment, entrepreneurship, and economic development with the United Nations Centre on Transnational Corporations (UNCTC) in New York, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Nairobi, and the Netherlands Directorate General for International Cooperation (DGIS) in The Hague. He is an Economic Geographer and Development Planner and has an MSc from the University of Utrecht, The Netherlands.



**Mr. Yongfu Ouyang** is an Economic Affairs Officer at the Investment Promotion Section of UNCTAD dealing with investment promotion and facilitation. He has coordinated a number of advisory projects for developing-country investment promotion agencies on national investment promotion strategy, sectoral investment promotion strategy, and institutional and operational issues. He also conducts research on policy and investment promotion trends, and authored or co-authored a number of United Nations reports or publications on investment promotion issues. He is a member of a team that prepares a monthly investment promotion newsflash for UNCTAD's Smart Promotion Network.

Before joining UNCTAD, Mr. Ouyang was a deputy division director dealing with international economic cooperation at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of China.



**Mr. Jason Munyan** is an Economic Affairs Officer in the Investment Promotion Section of UNCTAD, where he has conducted research on investment promotion strategies and the promotion of green investment. In other roles at UNCTAD, Mr. Munyan researched national policies on foreign investment and entrepreneurship trends and policies and he prepared reports on science, technology, and innovation for the United Nations Commission on Science and Technology for Development.

Prior to joining UNCTAD, Mr. Munyan was a Field Project Coordinator for the United Nations Industrial Development Organization's Investment and Technology Promotion Office in China, where he worked on-site with several Chinese cities to assist them in attracting investment for sustainable development. Before working in China, Mr. Munyan was an Associate at Goldman, Sachs & Co., where he analyzed internal audit results for the Board of Directors and regulators and examined relevant corporate governance practices. Mr. Munyan has a B.S. degree in Biochemistry, Mathematics, and Spanish from Brigham Young University.
